WEDNESDAY: read Romans 5: 6-9 and 1 John 5:18

What is our single greatest problem?

THURSDAY: read John 10: 11, 27-29 and Romans 8: 2-3a, 16, 28 From A1...list what Jesus Christ has done for us to solve this problem?

FRIDAY: read Titus 3: 3-8
