Q 29. WHY IS THE SON OF GOD CALLED "JESUS," THAT IS, SAVIOR?

A. Because He saves us from our sins, and because salvation should not be sought and cannot be found in any other.

Matthew 1:21; Hebrews 7:25 Acts 4:12; Luke 2:10-11

Q 30. Do those who look for their salvation and security in saints, in themselves, or elsewhere really believe in the only Savior Jesus?

A. No.

Although they boast of being His, by their deeds they deny the only Savior and deliverer, Jesus.

Either Jesus is not a perfect Savior, or those who by true faith receive this Savior, have in Him all they need for their salvation.

I Corinthians 1:13, 30-31; Galatians 5:4. Isaiah 9:7; Colossians 1:20, 2:10; John. 1:16; Matthew 23:28. I suggest using a notebook to record your answers, thoughts, and questions that come to mind as you read the catechism and scripture. When we meet it will help to have something written that you can refer back to as we discuss the lessons and pray for each other.

As we enter the second part of the catechism our attention turns from our sin to our deliverance. Write down two or three attributes of the Lord Jesus Christ from each week's lesson.
