Q 31. Why is He called "Christ," that is, Anointed?

SUNDAY: Read questions and answers with all scripture references

Last week we looked at the name "Jesus."

This week we look at the title "Christ" which means "anointed."

Q32 deals with the individual Christians, so each day we will focus on The Christ and "the little Christs."

MONDAY: Look up the word "anointed" in the dictionary.

Read Isaiah 9:6-7; Luke 4: 16-21. How is the Trinity at work in the anointing of Jesus?

Read Acts 11:19-26; 1 John 2:27 and Acts 1:4-5, 8. How are we anointed?

TUESDAY: As Prophet, Jesus Christ tells us the way to be right with God.

Read Matthew 7:28-29; Acts 3:19-24

Read 1 Peter 2:9 and Hebrews 13:15. How do we serve as prophets?

WEDNESDAY: As Priest, Jesus Christ becomes the way to be right with God.

Read Hebrews 9: 11-14, 24; Romans 8:33-34

Read Romans 12:1 and Romans 6:13. How do we serve as priests?

THURSDAY: As King, Jesus Christ governs and defends those on the journey.

Read Acts: 16:13-15; John 10:28

Read Colossians 3:5-9 and Ephesians 6:10-13. What does a "free conscience" have to do with our role as king in our fight against sin in our life?

FRIDAY: What does the future hold? Read Matthew 25:34 and Daniel 21-22, 27.
