And a second is like it:
You shall love your neighbor as yourself.

On these two commandments depend all the law and the prophets.

FRIDAY: read Romans 7:7

How is God's law both an instrument of condemnation and mercy?

SATURDAY: read the corresponding essay in *THE GOOD NEWS WE ALMOST FORGOT* Write down any thoughts and/or questions that come to mind after reading the essay.
